What it looks like


This animal has a green head and big eyes. It has a brown body and a long tail.

The Poison Mantis Frog is an amphibian and lives to be 25 years old.


Females lay eggs and care for their young until they are 2 years old.

The Poison Mantis Frog lives up to 25 years old in the wild.


The females lay eggs which turn into tadpoles and they usually care for their young until they are 2 years old.
